

# "Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the <u>renewing of your mind.</u> ~ Romans 12:2

- Q1 Christian Civics focuses on the biblical ideas of civil government.
- Q2 Politics today seems to focus on the acquisition of <u>power</u>.
- Q3 Christians have a dual citizenship: Citizens of <u>earth</u> and citizens of <u>heaven</u>.
- Q4 Christian Citizenship is fulfilling our <u>duty</u> to bring God's <u>perspective</u>, <u>principles</u> and <u>values</u> to all domains in our society, where they can be <u>heard</u>, <u>understood</u>, and <u>applied</u> for the benefit of all people.
- Q5 The two watershed questions of life are: What is the nature of <u>God</u> and what is the nature of <u>man</u>. These two questions seem to answer with over 90% accuracy what a person's view will be on dozens of cultural issues.
- Q6 Founding Father, Noah Webster, indicated that the history of the United States begins in Genesis with the creation of <u>man.</u>
- Q7 A key question for our nation is "Are we for the <u>Creator</u>? or at war with the <u>Creator</u>?
- Q8 God gave humankind the assignment to bring for the earths glory in all areas of life culture.
- Q9 God owns the title deed of earth.
- Q10 God dispenses His authority here on earth through 4 institutions <u>individuals</u>, <u>families</u>, <u>the church</u>, and <u>civil</u> <u>government</u>.
- Q11 **Individuals** God has made people in His image and He made them to be self governing according to the <u>Ten</u> Commandments. And to walk in harmony with Him exhibiting the <u>fruits</u> of the <u>spirit</u>.
- Q12 **Families** Are God's building block of society. It is God's instrument for producing additional self governing individuals. Families also take care of each other and care for the poor.
- Q13 **Civil Government** God's purpose for civil government is to <u>restrain</u> <u>evil</u> and <u>encourage</u> <u>good.</u>. Government encourages good works, but it not designed to do good works.
- Q14 **The church** is the conscience of society. It challenges individuals to a right relationship with God, families to healthy marriage and civil government to its duty to <u>restrain</u> evil and allow good to flourish.
- Q15 Society becomes broken when <u>civil</u> government overflows its boundaries.
- Q16 The Pilgrims brought these ideas to the new world
- Q17 Pilgrim Pastor, John Robinson, gave the ingredients of a health society. He said that a person who is easily <u>offended</u> could never be a healthy member of society.



- Q18 The <u>Mayflower Compact</u> formed the basis of civil government for the Pilgrims and then influenced the designs of State Constitutions and the Federal Constitution.
- Q19 The Mayflower Compact states that the Pilgrims undertook their endeavor for three purposes: "Having undertaken this voyage for The <u>Glory</u> of God, The <u>advancement</u> of the Christian Faith, The <u>honor</u> of King and Country"
- Q20 John Winthrop another Pilgrim Pastor said that the new colonies in Massachusetts were to be "be as a <u>city</u> upon a <u>hill.</u> Meaning that America was to be a light to the world.
- Q21 For 100 years before the Declaration of Independence, <u>Pastors</u> taught their people and society at large that people's rights came from God.
- Q22 Founding Father, <u>John</u> Adams new it was critical important for <u>pastors</u> to teach on the cultural issues of the day.
- Q23 Pastor Jonathan Mayhew preached a sermon in 1760 where he said it was imminently important that Christian <u>magistrates</u> (politicians) and Christian <u>people</u> should know and understand the purpose and limits of civil government.
- Q24 Pastor Jonathan Mayhew said this ""Civil tyranny is usually small in its beginning, like 'a drop in the <u>bucket</u>' till at length, like a mighty torrent, or the raging waves of the sea, it bears down on all before it, and deluges whole countries and empires."
- Q25 Pastor Jonathan Mayhew said this "This is true of tyranny in every shape. There can be nothing great and good where its influence reaches. For which reason it [is required that] every friend to truth and human kind, every lover of God and the Christian religion, to bear a part in opposing this hateful monster."
- Q26 The first Act of the Continental Congress of 1774 was to pray.
- Q27 A University of Houston Study showed That, <u>94</u>% of the most important statements by the founding fathers had their roots in scripture
- Q28 Proverbs 14:34 "Righteousness exalteth a nation; sin is a reproach to any people" This means that the people of a nation need to be moral and self-governing.
- Q29 **The Declaration of Independence** mentions God <u>four</u> times.
- Q30 **The Declaration of Independence** names of God are these: <u>Natures</u> God, The <u>Creator</u>, The Supreme <u>Judge</u> of the world, Divine <u>Providence</u>
- Q31– **The Declaration of Independence** states- "We hold these <u>Truths</u> to be self-evident, that all men are created <u>equal</u>, that they are endowed by their <u>Creator</u> with certain unalienable <u>Rights</u>, that among these are <u>Life</u>, <u>Liberty</u> and the Pursuit of Happiness"



- Q32 **The Declaration of Independence** states The Purpose of government is simple "to <u>secure</u> these rights, Governments are instituted among men"
- Q33 **The Declaration of Independence** states that governments derive their powers from "the <u>consent</u> of the governed". Meaning that the government serves the people and is responsible to the people, not the opposite where people are required to serve the needs of their rulers.
- Q34 **The Declaration of Independence** states "That whenever any form of Government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to <u>abolish</u> it and to institute new Government". Meaning that the government must protect the people's God given rights. When it ceases to do that, the people can change their government or abolish it.
- Q35 **The Declaration of Independence** -The Signers of the Declaration submitted their lives and plans to God's will with this profound statement "With a firm Reliance on the Protection of Divine <u>Providence</u>, We mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes, and our sacred <u>Honor"</u>
- Q36 **George Washington** said this about God's hand in Americas founding in his Inaugural Address "Every step, by which [we] have advanced to the character of an independent nation, seems to have been distinguished by some token of <u>Providential</u> Agency."
- Q37 **The Declaration of Independence** No other country in the world has a document that is a statement of unchanging principles that are true for all <u>people</u>, in all <u>places</u>, at all <u>times</u>
- Q38 **The Declaration of Independence** has been held up around the world whenever <u>Tyranny</u> is resisted.
- Q39 **The Core Question for our Nation is** "Are we as a Nation: For the <u>Creator</u>?" or "At War with the <u>Creator</u>?"
- Q40 The Core Question for us personally is "Are we For the Creator?" or "At War with the Creator?"
- Q41 The Statue of Liberty "Is standing on and holding the Declaration of Independence"
- Q42 **The Statue of Liberty 's** symbolism is that she is <u>moving</u> out into the world, taking the ideas of liberty to the world.
- Q43 **Constitution and Declaration** they can only be understood properly by realizing they work together. The Constitution <u>"serves"</u> the principles in the Declaration
- Q44 **Constitution and Declaration** the Declaration declares the <u>purpose</u> for why our country exists and the Constitution serves as the framework for how our government is <u>organized."</u>
- Q45 **Constitution and Declaration** the Declaration is like a heart it gives <u>life</u>. The Constitution is like the rib cage, it <u>protects</u> the heart, protects the life.
- Q46 **Constitution** Frederick Douglass, a great African American leader of the late 1800s, was initially a critic of the Constitution being "pro-slavery", but being open minded he studied it deeply and studied



the founders and did a complete 180 degree change proclaiming – ""Interpreted as it ought to be interpreted, the Constitution is a glorious liberty document."

Q47 – Historian and Speaker Dr. Marlene has said – "People are simply shocked to find out that our Constitution is the only one in the world written to <u>restrain</u> civil government. The rest of world live under Constitutions where Constitutions are written by government to give rights to the people.

Q48 **Constitution** – The first <u>52</u> words of the Constitution are the most important words of the Constitution as they define the purpose of the rest of the 4,000 words

Q49 **Constitution** - The first fifty two words of the Constitution state this:

We the People of the United States in order

- 1. To form a more perfect union
- 2. To establish justice
- 3. To ensure domestic tranquility
- 4. To provide for common <u>defense</u>
- 5. To promote the general welfare and (meaning laws that restrain evil and allow good to flourish, and protect the God given rights of the Declaration)
- 6. To secure the Blessings of <u>Liberty</u> to ourselves and our <u>posterity</u>.

Do ordain & establish this Constitution....

Q50 – James Madison, chief writer of the Constitution, said this – "If men were <u>angels</u>, no government would be necessary."

Q51– Thomas Jefferson said this – "In the question of power, then, let no more be said of confidence in man, But <u>bind</u> him down from mischief by the chains of the Constitution."

Q52 – Romans 3;23 says this about human nature - "For all have <u>sinned</u> and fall short of the glory of God."

Q53 \_ Jeremiah 17:9 says this about human nature - "The heart is <u>deceitful</u> above all things and beyond cure. Who can understand it?"

Q54 – What are the chains of the Constitution?

- 1) <u>Limited Powers</u>
- 2) Enumerated Powers
- 3) Separation of Powers
- 4) Checks & Balances on Power and Process
- 5) <u>Written</u>, permanent Constitution fixes it in place with amendments allowed
- 6) <u>Citizens</u> guarding these provisions

- Q55 **Constitution** The 3 branches of our national government are listed in this order in the Constitution: Legislature/Congress, Executive/President, Judicial/Supreme Court
- Q56 **Constitution** What branch was considered by the founders to be slightly MORE powerful than the others because it was closest to the people: <u>Legislative/Congress</u>
- Q57 **Constitution** What branch was considered by the founders to be the LEAST branch of the federal government: <u>Judicial/Supreme Court</u>
- Q58 **Constitution** Thomas Jefferson had this grave concern about the Supreme Court "The constitution is a mere thing of <u>wax</u> in the hands of the judiciary, which they may twist and shape into any form they please." Meaning they could make it say anything they wanted it to.
- Q59 **Constitution** Ultimately it's up to <u>us /"We the People"</u> To defend the Constitution. It is our responsibility.
- Q60 –Founding Father, Alexander Hamilton felt like God had lead the founders in the design of the Constitution he said "For my own part, I sincerely esteem it a system which without the finger of <u>God</u>, never could have been suggested and agreed upon by such a diversity of interests."
- Q61 **Constitution** The greatness of the American system of government is not that we have a national Constitution and Declaration on their own, but we have an entire Constitutional <u>System</u> of 50 State Republics, and County, and City Republics. Its this entire system that makes America great.
- Q62 One of the examples that the founders looked at for our system of government was the Old Testament example of the Hebrew <u>Republic</u> which Moses led.
- Q63 All <u>races</u> can find themselves in the American Experiment. Our best example of this is Jethro (descendent of Ham) giving Moses (descendent of Shem) advice and then the Founding Fathers (descendents of Japeth) trying to put the ideas in action.
- Q64 In studying government it is not a question of political parties but of political power.
- Q65 The terms left and <u>right</u> can mean different things in different countries... it is always a question of how much <u>power</u> you give a government and then how to control those people you put into office.
- Q66 George Washington said this about power "Government is not reason, it is not eloquence...It is <u>force!</u>
- Q67 The Bill of Rights was an additional provision for the founders to limit the <u>power</u> of the federal government.
- Q67 The First Amendment of the Bill of Rights says this: -

Congress shall make no law

1. respecting an establishment of religion,



- 2. or prohibiting the free exercise thereof;
- 3. or abridging the freedom of speech,
- 4. or of the press;
- 5. or the right of the people peaceably to assemble,
- 6. and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances

Q68 – If Congress is prohibited from making laws about religion, speech, the press, peaceful assembly, or petitioning of the government, it should mean that the federal government has no authority to make laws or direct states or citizens in any of these areas, that it should all be decided at the state level.

Q69– The 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> Amendments remind the federal government that the only power it has is the list of duties in the US Constitution. All the other rights remain with the individual States or the people.

Q70 – The 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment guarantees you the right to own a gun and <u>protect</u> yourself and your family from others and from the government.

Q71 – Amendments 3 through 8 – protect people from unwarranted searches so they can keep private information private and set up a fair justice system so they are treated fairly.

Q72 – The Bill of Rights names freedom of religion as the very first item. The means that you should have the <u>right</u> to share and live out your faith at any place and at any time – at home, at work, in college, in public schools, in government sanctioned events.....anywhere.

Q73 - George Washington and Abraham Lincoln and others warned future generation that there would be cunning, unprincipled people who would seek to <u>undermine</u> the Constitution and subvert it and these people need to be watched for and stood up to.

Q74 – Salt of the Earth – Matthew 5:13 - "You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt <u>loses</u> its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled by men." Jesus commands us to speak up and speak out.. to be salt.

Q75 – Light of the World – Matthew 5:14 –"You are the light of the world--like a <u>city</u> on a hilltop that cannot be hidden". You are called to let your light shine.

Q76 – St. Augustine on the nature of Truth said: "The truth is like a <u>lion.</u> You don't have to defend it. Let it <u>loose</u>. It will defend itself." We are called to speak up for the truth.

Q77 – Philosopher and Theologian Abrahm Kuyper said this: "There is not a square inch in the whole domain of our human existence over which Christ, who is Sovereign over all, does not cry, Mine!"

Q78 – We need to not put Jesus in a box... just like love is a multifaceted <u>diamond</u>, so Jesus is more than just a compassionate savior. He spoke things about good and bad civil leaders and civil government.



Q79 – Nehemiah told the followers of God in his day to: "Don't be afraid of them. Remember the Lord, who is great and awesome, And fight for your brothers, your sons and your daughters, your wives and your <u>homes</u>." ~ Nehemiah 4:14. This means we need to defend and contend for God's truth in the city/community in which you live.

#### Q80 – Action Items - What are we called to as Christian Citizens?

- Pray and Follow God
- <u>Love</u> People
- Make <u>Right</u> Judgments
- Be Salt and Light
- Fight for our wives, sons, daughters, homes

Q81 – Voting is a prescription for national health. "When the <u>righteous</u> are in authority, the people rejoice; But when a wicked man rules, the people groan" Proverbs 29:2. People of faith need to do their best to elect people of good character, courage, and competence to office. We "love our neighbor" when we "steward our vote" and elect good people to office.

Q82 - A special word to pastors from Rev Charles Finney, "

- If there is a decay of conscience, the <u>pulpit</u> is responsible for it.
- If the public press lacks moral discernment, the pulpit is responsible for it.
- If the church is degenerate and worldly, the pulpit is responsible for it.
- If the world loses its interest in Christianity, the <u>pulpit</u> is responsible for it.
- If Satan rules in our halls of legislation, the <u>pulpit is</u> responsible for it.
- If our politics become so corrupt that the very foundations of our government are ready to fall away, the <u>pulpit</u> is responsible for it."

- Q96 The Chief Architect of the Constitution was James Madison
- Q97 George Washington was sworn into office on April 30, 1789
- Q98 After George Washington was sworn in and gave His inaugural address, Congress, the President and the Supreme Court justices they went to a <u>prayer</u> and commencement service.
- Q98 The first capital of the US government was New York City.
